

If we could have had a glimpse of this year, would we have welcomed the journey? I hope you have been busy praying, writing notes, making phone calls, sending text messages, using "Zoom" opportunities, and even making smaller group visits if possible to each of your communities. Jesus closes His conversation with a simple truth—"waiting patiently" requires actively "helping the least of these My bothers and sisters" - vs. 40 and 45. The reality of "being the Gospel" is being the hands, feet, and voice of Jesus as we continue to touch our native community with His love, forgiveness, and healing power. They cannot wait for a "brighter, more stable future. Let us not be afraid of the unknown future, but let us walk as ambassadors of the love and light of Jesus. Bernie Prinzen



PERSONAL PARAGRAPHS and <u>IMPORTANT NOTIFICATION</u>

Shirley Ohlman Hamilton



My marriages with men who were godly, gracious and gifted, Richard Ohlman and Don Hamilton, graced my life. Each one exhibited love and compassion for people. With each one, the Lord moved upon us to establish a pioneer and dynamic work among Canada's indigenous peoples. The first stirrings of this ministry occurred in the 1980's, then called the Mobile Ministry, run out of Stouffville, Ontario. A move to Sudbury enabled the spread of the work, especially on the reserves on Highways #69, #17 and then #6 on Manitoulin Island. After Richard (Ohlman) passed away on Easter Sunday 1995 (what a day to go to Heaven when celebrating the resurrection!), I continued the work alone. Mobile Ministry then evolved into DayStar Native Outreach, named from II Peter 1:19 which speaks of "the light shining in a dark place, till the day dawns and the daystar arises in your hearts" (KJV). Significant summer ministries were being held on several reserves with volunteer

church teams. God dramatically brought Pastor/Dr. Don Hamilton into my life. His pastoral and management skills proved to be what DayStar needed. Its been eleven years since his passing. This year, 2020, marks forty years working with Native people, and twenty-two years of fulltime ministry on the Wiikwemkoong Unceded Territory (Reserve, Manitoulin Island, Ontario)

DayStar is a firmly rooted Christian ministry to First Nations people in the midnorth of Ontario, with a divine mandate and mission to Canada's indigenous peoples. Every day results in an adventure. In the morning it's unknown. By evening I reflect on the Spirit's leading, rejoicing in the rare opportunities I have with my wonderful friends and acquaintances, including the broken, hurting, and the grieving. The trust they place with me indeed is humbling.

As of January 1, 2021, I'll be transitioning into a new role with DayStar, still as a fulltime worker, working in the areas of my passion and true calling. Bernie Prinzen will be assuming the role of Director at that point. When growing up in Prince Edward County, Ontario, Bernie was a 4th grade student in a rural school where my husband Richard taught religious education and had influence

on young Bernie's life. Now things have come full circle. Bernie and his wife Elizabeth have served on Day-Star's outreach team, Parkdale Baptist in Belleville, to Sagamok Anishnawbek (First Nation near Massey, Ontario) for twenty summers. Their hearts were increasingly burdened as they reached out to that community with great love.

My role will include community involvement in Wiikwemkoong, engagements/deputation with churches and organizations, initiate a new fulltime ministry at Whitefish River First Nation, and assist DayStar U.S. in beginning a ministry in Michigan. I'll be able to formulate my own schedule and have flexibility to visit my family and to do some creative writing. Yea! My goal is to write an informative book or manual as to Native people and culture, and effective ways to share Christ in their culture.



The years have flown by and Heaven has viewed your support and the notable impact it has made in real lives that have experienced transformation by the power of the Gospel. Individuals and families have HOPE and PEACE because of you.

Early on there were various camp and day club outreaches amongst many different native communities throughout Ontario. During these early years, Shirley's heart was broken for Native People and God used her to encourage others to join in the work. In 1998 Don and Shirley Hamilton formalized Daystar Native Outreach. The organization has partnered with many churches in North America. Throughout these years we have seen Daystar Native Outreach used by God in many amazing ways to impact each native community.

As the Director of Daystar over these 25 years, Shirley has been a listener and a learner. She has shown in a genuine fashion the love of Christ, the need for Christ, the hope found in Christ, and the life that comes from Christ. During these years Shirley has served in humility and gentleness. She has been the constant throughout this entire time persevering through the death of Don Hamilton in 2009 and having to oversee the creation of a new board in 2008.

Over the last few years Shirley and the Board have been praying, planning, and working towards identifying a successor to become the next Director. The Board is excited and pleased to announce that Bernie Prinzen will assume the position of Executive Director on January 1, 2021. The transfer of Directorship has been in process for over a year. The Daystar Board is active and fully behind this "transferring of the mantle". On behalf of the Daystar Board, I solicit your prayers for Shirley, Bernie, and the Daystar Staff during these remaining months as we all seek God's counsel and wisdom. Daystar Native Outreach is not our own, but God's. We are humbly the stewards of what God has entrusted. We also know that God is at work in each of our lives and in the lives of precious folks in Native Communities. God is establishing His Kingdom and is on the move! Our desire is to faithfully follow Him and humbly serve Him and it would be with much joy to have you continue alongside.
